

# ODNADATTA TRACK 50 TOURIST GUIDE

## WILLIAM CREEK - OODNADATTA - WILLIAM CREEK

206.6 kilometres

### CAUTION

1. Roads in this area can be adversely affected by rain. Seek local advice at all times.
  2. Take care when crossing grids and creeks
  3. No gates.
- An hotel, store and petrol supplies are available at both William Creek and Oodnadatta.

There are no other tourist facilities en route. The terrain varies from flat to undulating plains with occasional sand ridges, stony hills and tablelands. The flats carry salt-bush and starbush, while the sand ridges carry canegrass and Marpoos (wattles). The tablelands carry saltbush. The land is used for beef cattle grazing. The creeks are mostly lined with Coolibah, but some are lined with Gidgee (Acacia Cambagei). Take care when crossing creek beds because of their sandy nature.

### ROAD CONDITIONS

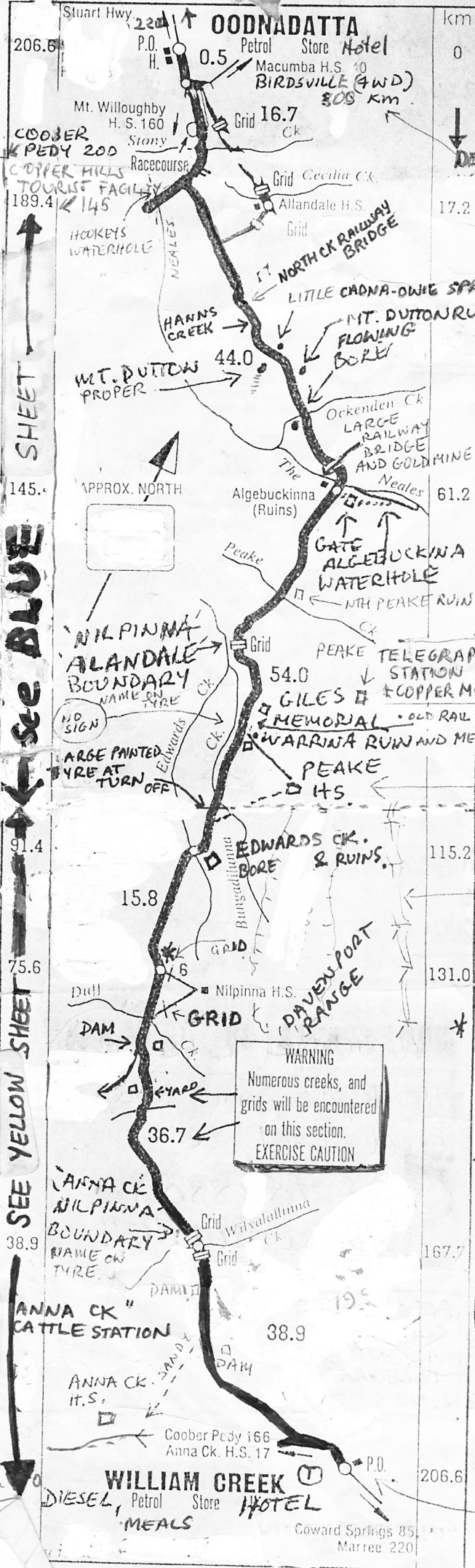
Earth formed with sections of loose stone, sandy patches and bulldust. Rough creek crossings.
